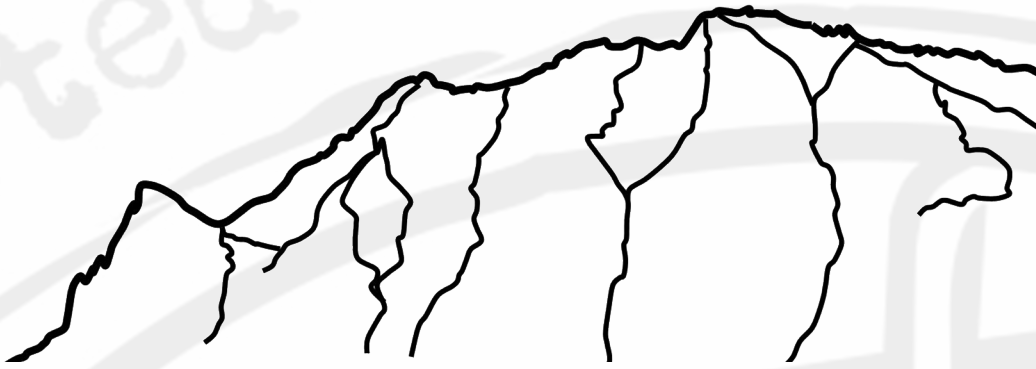

What does “sukakpak” mean?



Sukakpak Mountain is an iconic mountain easily spotted along the Dalton Highway about 30 miles north of Coldfoot. The word “Sukakpak” is an Inupiat Eskimo word that means “marten deadfall.” A deadfall is a specific type of trap traditionally used to catch martens.

Incredible wildlife

Alaskan wood frogs are able to survive sub-zero temperatures during the winter by freezing! Two-thirds of their body water turns to ice. When the spring comes, they simply thaw and resume life as normal.

Woolly bear caterpillars can live for three or four years, but they spend the majority of each year frozen in cocoons, only thawing in order to feed during the month of June. Once they emerge as adult moths, they only live for one to two weeks.

A bit(e) of café history

In 1981, Dick Mackey, an Iditarod champion, set up an old school bus in Coldfoot and began selling burgers to truckers driving the haul road from Fairbanks to Prudhoe Bay.

The truck stop soon grew in popularity due to its convenient location. Truckers began dropping off packing crates and building materials to be used in the construction of a more permanent building.

As the truckers stopped in to eat, they also worked to pound nails or finish bits of construction. As a final celebration of their accomplishment, the truckers raised the center pole, engraved with their names, for future truckers and guests to see.

You can still see the pole on display behind the front desk in the Café!

The aurora borealis

We like to think we’re the best place in the world to see the Northern Lights. Here’s why:

- ⇒ We’re right under the Aurora Oval, so you can see 100% of visible auroras on clear nights from right here in Camp, or from our cabin in Wiseman.
- ⇒ By the time the best auroras are out, 80% of nights have completely clear skies. That means great visibility pretty much every night.
- ⇒ We’re so far from any city that light pollution is minimized!
- ⇒ Because we’re above the Arctic Circle, we have dark skies from the 21st of August to the 21st of April: this means excellent aurora viewing can happen for almost eight months!



gates of the arctic



The Gates of the Arctic National Park & Preserve contains no roads or trails. Visitors must either fly in or hike in from the Dalton Highway or the village of Anaktuvuk Pass.

Arctic birds

Though there are about 200 species of birds that migrate to the Arctic during the summer months, there are only thirteen species that live here year-round.

The Dalton highway

Though the Dalton was built in 1974 and turned over to the state in 1978, the road all the way to Prudhoe Bay wasn’t fully opened to the public until 1994.

The two percent

Only 2% of visitors to Alaska travel north of the Arctic Circle.
